Grading for the Oxford Hip Score

May indicate severe hip arthritis. It is highly likely that you may well require some Score 0 to 19 form of surgical intervention, contact your family physician for a consult with an Orthopaedic Surgeon.

May indicate moderate to severe hip arthritis. See your family physician for an **Score 20 to 29** assessment and x-ray. Consider a consult with an Orthopaedic Surgeon.

May indicate mild to moderate hip arthritis. Consider seeing you family physician for an assessment and possible x-ray. You may benefit from non-surgical treatment, **Score 30 to 39** such as exercise, weight loss, and /or anti-inflammatory medication

Score 40 to 48 May indicate satisfactory joint function. May not require any formal treatment.
